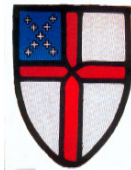

Experiencing Epiphany

Epiphany is a major feast of the church celebrated on January 6. In fact, the Eastern Church focuses on it, The Festival of the Manifestation of



Christ, rather than on December 25, the Feast of the Nativity. Epiphany began in celebra-

tion of the significant moments of appearance among humans as the Word made Flesh — Jesus' birth, his baptism, and also included the wedding at Cana, being his first miracle in public.

Epiphany is NOT only the day we commemorate the three kings coming from the East to worship the Christ Child. It is a season which calls us to pay attention, as in Advent, to all that is around us. Not because we are waiting for our Savior to be born, but because "your light has come." We are drawn into exploring who is it that Jesus is -- the light in our darkness. Our scripture lessons for the season of Epiphany, which extends through Feb 16 in 2010, will reveal more and more about who

this Christ Child is and how he is made manifest in our lives.

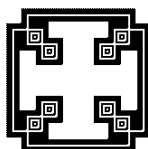
